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We are proud to present a comprehensive evaluation of the work we carried out during the Fall 2024-25 semester as Sabancı University Civic Involvement Projects (CIP). This semester has been another important period in which we took significant steps toward encouraging our university students to engage in social responsibility projects with an active citizenship mindset

As part of the CIP 101 course, 714 of our students participated in 41 different projects that directly contributed to society. Through our education, support, and awareness-focused projects, our students worked with children in primary schools, carried out activities promoting environmental and sustainability awareness, and took part in programs aimed at improving the quality of life for elderly and disabled individuals. Additionally, awareness initiatives were conducted on contemporary issues such as digital citizenship, consumer awareness, disaster preparedness, and human rights.

Beyond the coursework, we engaged our students with various social topics through extracurricular activities. The Human Library event provided a space for questioning societal prejudices and understanding diverse life experiences, while our seminars and workshops equipped students with a more informed and well-rounded perspective on social responsibility. On December 5, 2024, World Volunteers Day, we presented the first awards of the "Award Program For High School Students." We hope to see continued strong interest in this program in the coming years.

I would like to extend my sincere gratitude to our supervisors, advisors, and the CIP office team for their dedication throughout this process. Seeing our students approach social issues with sensitivity and actively participate in solutions is our greatest source of motivation. This report is merely a summary of the efforts carried out with the contributions of the CIP team. I am honored to be part of this ever-growing and evolving initiative, and we will continue to expand our impact and promote social responsibility in the coming semesters.

Civic Involvement Projects

Civic Involvement Projects is a training program that aims to learn and practice participatory democracy by individuals. With the awareness of active citizenship, it is aimed that university students are aware of the society they live in. Civic Involvement Projects (CIP) develop projects in the field of social responsibility through the CIP 101 course and extracurricular activities.

The CIP 101 course is a mandatory course within Sabanci University's curriculum that every student must complete to graduate. Students who wish to do so can voluntarily participate in the CIP 101 course throughout their university years. CIP 101 is a field-based course, allowing students to engage in experiential learning rather than just theoretical knowledge. The course is automatically added to students' programs upon their enrollment at the university. Students choose and participate in one of the availabl projects based on their interests.

Beyond the CIP 101 course, various projects such as the the Human Library, conferences, and Discover Yourself are organized, offering opportunities for anyone interested in different topics over time.



• In the Fall 2024-25 semester, 714 students enrolled in the CIP 101 course. The distribution of students is as follows:








Course Success Rates

First Lecture



As part of the Animal Rights Projects, a visit was made to the Kadıköy Municipality Animal Shelter. During the visit, dogs living at the shelter were walked, and support was provided for their basic care. Emre Kaplan from Türkiye Without Cages delivered an online Animal Rights and Philosophy seminar. Nehir Ünal, Co-President of Sabancı University's Vegan Club, gave a Animal Rights and Veganism seminar. The seminar covered speciesism, stray animals, farm animals, cultural eating habits, and animal welfare. Additionally, discussions included what it means to be a vegan at the university and how to adapt animal rights activism to the campus environment. Moreover, Elif Üngör, Assistant General Manager of Akkomarka Restaurant Group, and Emir Sami İşmen, Assistant General Manager of IBB Beltur, from the representatives of the Responsible Restaurant Movement, shared their activities to prevent food waste and promote proper consumption habits.

TOM@University Project



As part of the TOM@University Project, Sabancı University Faculty of Engineering and Natural Sciences Faculty Member Süha Orhun Mutluergil shared the problems he encountered on campus and while teaching as a person with spinal cord paralysis with CIP 101 students. The project aimed to help the students develop solutions to the problems encountered and produce a product aligned with the feedback received. In the 2024 Spring Semester TOM@University Project, a portable wheelchair organizer was designed and made more user-friendly. As part of the project, Zülal Tannur, one of the Sabancı Foundation's 14th Season Changemakers and the founder of NeuroVision AI Tech and From Your Eyes, talked about her work at NeuroVision Al Tech, which develops machine vision solutions for a broad spectrum from humans to innovative technologies. She explained how vision technologies work and discussed the steps involved in developing and implementing an idea to solve a problem. An online session was also held with Hannah Clark, a TOM Fellow from Duquesne University, who shared inspiring projects and community initiatives implemented on their campus with CIP 101 students.

Disaster Awareness Projects



Within the scope of Disaster Awareness Projects, activities were carried out with TAKIM Search and Rescue Association. As part of the project, CIP 101 students received training on essential disaster awareness, medical intervention during disasters, disaster psychology, and psychological first aid. They also participated in drills conducted on campus. To emphasize the importance of disaster volunteerism and raise awareness across the campus, students created videos about disasters as part of their outreach efforts. Sabancı University Search and Rescue Club (SUAK) and the staff team (SUDAK) supported these activities.

Consumer Awareness Projects



Within the scope of Consumer Awareness Projects, Caner G. Yalın from Pulsec Cycle Co. conducted an Electronic Waste Workshop. The concepts of waste hierarchy, recycling, upcycling and downcycling were discussed within the workshop. After examining electronic waste materials in function and design, they were disassembled down to the most minor parts using hand tools, and their working principles were discussed. The Social Impact Center of the Food Rescue Association was visited. At the Social Impact Center, students supported the operations related to the sorting, packaging and distributing food and contributed to delivering the rescued food to the beneficiaries. Fuat Ergin from the Association for the Development of Consumer Awareness gave a seminar on consumer rights. The Compost Workshop, organized by CIP supervisor Alperen Davran, aimed to raise students' awareness of sustainability, waste management and eco-friendly lifestyles. Students of the Consumer Awareness Projects participated in the "How Do We Mind Our Waste?" seminar organized by the Mind Your Waste Foundation, the delivery worker rights course organized by the Delivery Worker Rights Association and the activities of the Responsible Restaurant Movement.

Digital Citizenship Projects



As part of the Digital Citizenship Project, discussions were held on social media, hate speech on social media, cyberbullying, artificial intelligence and the future of the internet. These discussions aimed to support the participants in becoming conscious and responsible citizens in the digital world. In addition, Dean of the Faculty of Engineering and Natural Sciences Prof. Dr. Erkay Savaş, Faculty Member Prof. Dr. Albert Levi and Dr. Arsalan Javeed gave a Cyber Security Seminar. Within the scope of the EU-funded enCRYPTON project, Erkay Savaş gave a detailed presentation on "Cyber Security and Cryptology", Albert Levi on "IoT Security" and Arsalan Javeed on "Are Passwords Secure?". This provided a comprehensive overview of the digital security landscape's challenges and innovations.

Urban and Environmental Awareness Project



A flora walk was organized on campus with Landscape Architect Fatih Özkanca from Tepe Peyzaj to familiarize students with the plants at Sabancı University. During the walk, a discussion was held about wildlife, human life within nature, landscape, the beginning of landscape architecture in Türkiye, and its current state. The impact of highways and factories around the university on living organisms was also addressed. To ensure clean and livable coastal areas and contribute to creating sustainable cities, a coastal cleanup event was held at Pendik Beach. Emrah Bilge and Gökçe Karaçocuk from the Çöpüne Sahip Çık (Mind Your Waste) Foundation held a seminar on the topic, "How Can We Take Care of Our Trash?". The seminar covered topics such as what trash is and why it's essential, the state of the trash problem in the world and Türkiye, the relationship between the current economic system and trash, what it means to "take care of our trash," and what we can do about it. Additionally, a discussion on spatial accessibility was held with students who photographed accessible and inaccessible areas on campus.

Human Rights Projects



As part of the project, an online seminar on Gender and Migration was held with Fatmanur Delioğlu, a PhD student at the Balsillie School of International Affairs. During the seminar, key concepts related to migration were explained, and the intersectional approach's importance in understanding migration was emphasized. The Nezahat Gökyiğit Botanical Garden was visited, and participants gained comprehensive information about the garden's special collections under the guidance of Nihan Sevinç Muşdal, the Curator of the Istanbul Plant Collection and Landscape Architect. Mesut Çeki, the President of the Delivery Worker Rights Association, was also a guest at the project and shared the founding story of Delivery Worker News and Delivery Worker Rights Association, their work as a rights-based association and their struggle for their professional rights. The Project group participated in several events, including the "How Can We Take Care of Our Trash?" seminar organized by the City and Environmental Awareness Project, sessions on Sexual Health Education and Gender and Women's Rights organized by the Gender and Sexual Health Project, and the HIV Awareness Seminar and sessions on Tic Disorders and Tourette Syndrome organized by the Health Project.

Urban and Environmental Awareness Projects - WWF-Türkiye Freshwater Project



At the beginning of the project, WWF-Türkiye Volunteer Program experts provided information about the project process and a Civil Society and Volunteering Workshop was held within the project's scope. Together with WWF-Türkiye Volunteer Program Officer Aylin Dinç, preliminary research on nearby water resources and wetlands was conducted and relevant data was collected. WWF-Türkiye Freshwater Program Specialist Gökçen Karaduman emphasized the importance of wetlands before the field trip with online seminars and shared observation techniques with the students. A field visit was made to the Riva River, and experts were accompanied to assess factors such as the wetland's habitat, ecosystem, biodiversity, industry, urbanization, and agricultural activities. At the end of the project, the students prepared a report that included the observations they made as a result of the online training and the field trip.





























Health Projects



As part of the Health Projects, various events focused on essential topics such as addictions and sexual health. A blood donation campaign for the Turkish Red Crescent (Kızılay) was held on campus, and CIP 101 students supported Kızılay during this process. Rojda Çelik from the Positive Life Association conducted an HIV Awareness Seminar. İremsu Yıldız, a student from Bahçeşehir University's Faculty of Medicine and the Gender Equality and Sexual Health Coordinator of the Turkish Medical Students Association, gave a training on Safe Relationships and Safe Sexuality. A comprehensive Sexual Health Education session was conducted for CIP 101 students by the Urolog Assoc. Prof. Dr. Yılören Tanıdır. Gökçesu Özgül Kalafat from SU Gender gave a presentation on Gender and Women's Rights. Brochures related to sexual health were distributed by CIP 101 students on campus. Students from the Gender and Sexual Health Project participated in the seminar on Safe Sexuality and Safe Relationships, organized by the Health Project. During the project process, topics such as feminism, intersectional feminism, and being an LGBT+ individual were addressed. Additionally, a workshop was held to raise awareness about HIV. These events aimed to increase students' awareness of gender equality, safe relationships, and sexual health, to enhance their understanding of these critical issues.





Ankara Tarhan College CIP Training





Companions to Brave Girls



In the Companions to Brave Girls Project, realized in collaboration with Aslıhan Dağıstanlı Aysev, author of the book "Companions to Brave Girls", students living in socioeconomically disadvantaged regions are given online English lessons by volunteer students from Sabancı University. In the Spring Semester of 2024, 20 volunteer Sabancı University students supported primary, middle, and high school students living in Batman, Gaziantep, İzmir, Kırşehir, Şanlıurfa.

Sabancı Foundation Changemakers Program Sabancı University Special Award



In line to raise university students' awareness of the society they live in with the awareness of active citizenship, Civic Involvement Projects and Sabancı Foundation have been collaborating since 2020 in the Changemakers Program. In 2025, Hale Uçuş, one of the 15th Season Changemakers with the Barrier-Free Mathematics Education Platform, was awarded the Sabancı University Special Award by the votes of socially conscious Sabancı University students.

Human Library







Human Library was held at Sabancı University on November 26, 2024, at Sabancı University Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences. As with regular libraries, the Human Library consists of readers, librarians, books, and book catalogs. The only difference between this library and the rest is that the books in the Human Library are people like you and us, and engage in a personal dialogue with their readers rather than just "being read". The starting point of the library is "Do not judge the book by its cover!" The books in this library are from different segments of society, struggling with prejudices and stereotypes and various life experiences.

Human Library welcomed the Books such as daughter of an Alzheimer's patient, homeless, gay, bisexual, search and rescue, stutterer, ex-anorexic, a gay mother, a person with cerebral palsy, vegan, albino, female train driver, delivery worker, visually impaired guitarist, a person with tourette syndrome.

Books and readers who attended the event shared their experiences as follows:

First of all, the interest of young people made me happy.
Curious questions such as how can we recognize
Alzheimer's, what are the first symptoms, and how is
forgetfulness here different from ordinary forgetfulness?
Remembering, recognizing and expressing oneself.
It is a journey where the things that make us who we
are are lost in our social relationships. A challenge not
only for the patient but for everyone affected, for the
whole family. Alzheimer's is the disease with the highest
caregiver burden. I thought these young people with
high energy and brilliant minds could easily overcome
this burden. I admired how curious, empathetic and
intelligent they were.

During the event, it was very valuable to support and, so to speak, guide the students who went through similar processes with me based on my process. From the outside, it is sometimes very easy to understand that a person has an eating disorder, but sometimes it is just as difficult. For this reason, I became a book that hits the point of not judging a book by its cover. At first, I thought a lot about how it would make me feel to tell the same things, but at the end of the day I realized that sharing with different people in every session helped me to see this process I went through from different windows.

Being read as a book in the Human Library by the students and academics of our school was a wonderful experience in every aspect. It was very motivating and inspiring for me to discuss my ethical values on animal rights with my readers and explain my way of life, which I sometimes felt left out of the general perception by my environment or strange! I left the event feeling more understood and made a difference.

Supervisor Selections



Team leaders conduct the CIP 101 course, referred to as supervisors, who are composed of volunteers. Supervisor selections are held every term.


The supervisor selection process consists of three stages:

- Submission of applications by candidate students.
- Group interviews.
- Individual interviews.

81 students applied to become supervisors, including 47 women and 34 men.

Between December 16-19, 2024, a total of 15 group interview sessions were conducted. 55 students qualified for one-on-one interviews.

During the one-on-one interviews held between December 23-25, 2024, 29 students were selected as supervisors, including 2 international students.



The projects carried out within the scope of the CIP 101 course are conducted with team leaders, whom we call supervisors. After leading projects for four semesters, each supervisor takes on the role of an overvisor and continues to work by specializing in their preferred areas within the CIP. Five of our supervisors for the Fall 2024–25 semester are international students.
