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We are pleased to present the evaluation of the work we carried out throughout the 2024-25 Spring Semester as part of Sabancı University's Civic Involvement Projects (CIP). This semester once again marked a comprehensive process that encouraged our university students to participate in social responsibility projects with an awareness of active citizenship and enabled them to directly contribute to society.

Within the scope of the CIP 101 course, 215 of our students took active roles in projects focused on education, support, and raising awareness. Our students organized activities in primary schools and carried out work to strengthen the social lives of elderly individuals in nursing homes. In addition, they contributed to society in areas such as sign language, disaster awareness, human rights, gender equality, and environmental awareness; and carried out awareness-raising activities on current issues such as digital citizenship, consumer awareness, and sustainability.

Our memberships in the Talloires Network of Engaged Universities and the University Social Responsibility Network, the Human Library: Books That Read event, and the Discover Yourself Küçükköy Project were among the highlights of this semester. These events and projects not only reinforced students' sense of social responsibility but also contributed to the expansion of our university's sphere of influence through national and international collaborations.

I would like to thank our supervisors, overvisors, and the CIP Office team for their efforts throughout this entire process. The sensitivity our students show towards social issues, their active participation, and the impact they create are our greatest sources of motivation. This report is a summary of the work realized with the contributions of the CIP team. I feel great happiness and pride in being a part of this ever-growing and evolving structure.

In the upcoming semesters, we will continue to promote the understanding of social responsibility and expand our area of impact both nationally and internationally.

Civic Involvement Projects

Civic Involvement Projects is a training program that aims to learn and practice participatory democracy by individuals. With the awareness of active citizenship, it is aimed that university students are aware of the society they live in. Civic Involvement Projects (CIP) develop projects in the field of social responsibility through the CIP 101 course and extracurricular activities.

The CIP 101 course is a mandatory course within Sabanci University's curriculum that every student must complete to graduate. Students who wish to do so can voluntarily participate in the CIP 101 course throughout their university years. CIP 101 is a field-based course, allowing students to engage in experiential learning rather than just theoretical knowledge. The course is automatically added to students' programs upon their enrollment at the university. Students choose and participate in one of the availabl projects based on their interests.

Beyond the CIP 101 course, various projects such as the the Human Library, conferences, and Discover Yourself are organized, offering opportunities for anyone interested in different topics over time.








Course Success Rates

Repeating Students for the Course



First Lecture


In the first class, information about CIP and the projects was presented by Zeynep Bahar. In the second week, project presentations were conducted by the overvisors.



Education Oriented Projects

Projects in Primary Schools



Within the scope of the Projects in Primary Schools, collaborations were established with 75. Yıl Mesut Yılmaz Primary School, Bilgi Primary School, and Mevlana Primary School. Various activities were organized on topics such as the importance of rules in daily life, discrimination and peer bullying, the concept of money and awareness of frugality, as well as general knowledge. The "Me Book" and "Tree of Love" activities aimed to help children get to know themselves and express their emotions. In addition, artistic and garden activities were carried out to support children's creativity. Throughout the term, experiences were gained that contributed to the development of both the children and the university students.

As part of the Sign Language Project, students attended a training session on Turkish Sign Language conducted by Ferdi Emir Çelik from the Civic Involvement Projects Office. In this training, students learned about the basic expressions and letters of Turkish Sign Language.









































Support-Oriented Projects

Nursing Home Visits Projects



As part of the Nursing Home Visits Projects, various activities were organized to support the elderly in staying physically and mentally active. Within this scope, events such as quizzes, artistic activities like coloring, listening to music, and playing board games were held. Additionally, a special activity was conducted under the theme "If I Were 20 Again". In this activity, students received advice from the elderly about their youth and listened to their past experiences. Furthermore, with the guidance of a qualified instructor, a session including light physical exercises and breathing practices was conducted, aiming to increase their bodily awareness and support their physical health.

Awareness-Oriented Projects

Consumer Awareness Project



As part of the Consumer Awareness Project, a Zero Waste Training was provided by TEMA Foundation Sabanci University representative Feyza Küçükateş and CIP Overvisor Zeynep Kılınçer. The training aimed to raise students' awareness about waste management and to encourage individual preventive actions. Videos related to fast fashion, the recycling trend in the fashion industry, and greenwashing were watched, followed by an interactive discussion. To make the issue of consumer awareness more visible, students produced video content on campus.

Disaster Awareness Projects



As part of the Disaster Awareness Project, CIP 101 students participated in the UCTalks session titled "Drought, Water Scarcity, Poverty and Inaction: Sudden Weather Events and Vulnerable Groups" organized by the Foundations Development Directorate of Sabancı University. In the session, Ayşe Kudat, Ertan Karabıyık, and Özgür Çetinkaya discussed the climate crisis and the impacts of extreme weather events caused by the climate crisis on vulnerable groups. As part of the project, a Basic Disaster Awareness Training was conducted by CIP supervisor Tahsin Can Dündar. In the training, what should and should not be done before, during, and after an earthquake was explained. CIP supervisor Tahsin Can Dündar also organized an OpenStreetMap Workshop. Students actively participated in the mapping process by working on Alemdağ Street in Orhangazi. A Disaster Psychology Training was conducted by YÖRET Foundation representatives Gizem Önal and Nesrin Naz Aydın. In the training, the stages of the psychosocial support processes carried out by the YÖRET Foundation both in and outside of disaster zones, the methods of implementation, and personal experiences gained in the field were shared in detail. Another Disaster Psychology class was given by Nebi Sümer, Faculty Member of the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences at Sabancı University. The class addressed the psychological responses that individuals may experience following an earthquake. It was emphasized that everyone should learn to provide basic psychological first aid even without having a professional certificate or specialized training. The training also explained, with examples, that different approaches may be needed in the psychological recovery processes of different social groups after an earthquake. Raha Akhavan, Faculty Member at Sabancı Business School, gave a lecture on Disaster Logistics. The lecture covered the key differences between traditional supply chains and humanitarian aid supply chains. The critical role of accessing accurate information during aid processes and how social media can be an effective tool for quickly identifying needs were discussed. As part of the project, videos on forest fires and solar flares were watched and discussions were held on these topics as well.

Digital Citizenship Project



As part of the Digital Citizenship Project, CIP supervisors Furkan Gönen and Zeynep Duru Sezer covered the history and future of the internet, discussing the emergence process and the main transformation phases of the internet. The transition from Web 1.0 to Web 2.0 and Web 3.0 was discussed in terms of its impact on user experience and the concept of digital citizenship. Following this, predictions about the future of the internet shaped by technologies such as artificial intelligence, the Internet of Things (IoT), and virtual reality were also shared. A conversation on copyright and shared usage rights was held with former CIP supervisor Ege Atacan Doğan. Within this scope, a study was conducted on the usage rights of visual content on the internet and the ways these rights are regulated. As part of the project, students walked around the lake on campus and took photographs. Then, an archive consisting of photos of the lake at Sabancı University was created on the Wikimedia Commons platform.

Human Rights Project



As part of the Human Rights Project, Meriç Çağlar from Sabancı University Gender and Women's Studies Excellence Center (SU Gender) gave a lecture on Refugee Rights. In the class, the concept of refugeehood was examined historically and conceptually through key terms such as migrant, refugee, and asylum seeker in international law. Şule Ceylan and Ömer Ceylan from the Association of Families and Friends of LGBTI+ in Turkey (LİSTAG) held a talk on campus titled "Being an LGBT+ Family." During the event, experiences of being a family member of an LGBT+ individual were shared, and LiSTAG's support and solidarity efforts toward families with LGBT+ children were presented. Erdal Aydın, Faculty Member at Sabancı Business School, visited the CIP 101 class with his dogs Totoro and Clio. Erdal Aydın shared his experiences regarding the responsibilities that come with having pets. Additionally, students participated in a talk by Prof. Dr. Zafer Yenal, Faculty Member at Sabancı University Business School, titled "Sustainability in Agriculture: Global Problems and Local Solutions."

Urban and Environmental Awareness Project



As part of the Urban and Environmental Awareness Project, an Accessibility Workshop was conducted with CIP 101 students on campus. During the workshop, students photographed areas on campus that were easily accessible as well as areas where access was difficult or impossible. Afterwards, a discussion was held about how spatial barriers are experienced in daily life. Sabancı University Landscape Architect Fatih Özkanca led a Flora Walk on campus. During the walk, the campus vegetation was explored and environmental awareness was discussed. With the support of Istanbul Metropolitan Municipality, a coastal cleanup event was organized at Pendik Coast to raise environmental awareness. Students involved in this project also participated in the OpenStreetMap Workshop conducted as part of the Disaster Awareness Project.

Gender and Sexual Health Projects



As part of the March 8 International Women's Day activities, a Scavenger Hunt event on dating violence was held with SU Gender. Students from the Gender Project also participated in the event. Sexual Health Education was provided by the project supervisor Ayça Sezgin. Additionally, a video about women's sexual health products was watched, and these products were introduced to the students. Students from the Gender Project also attended the talk titled "Being an LGBT+ Family" with Şule Ceylan and Ömer Ceylan from the LISTAG Association. Discussions were held on patriarchy, violence against women, and the Istanbul Convention. Students prepared brochures on violence against women and distributed them on campus. The game "Take a Step Forward" was played from a gender perspective. Students decided whether to step forward by considering the social conditions of the character they portrayed. A discussion took place on the effects of digitalization on romantic relationships and how online dating applications transform gender norms. Along with the opportunities provided by digital platforms, traditional gender roles and relational dynamics reproduced on these platforms were also discussed.

CIP 101 Project with International Students



As part of the project, interactive discussions were held with students on healthy living and coping methods for stress. Following the discussions, a volleyball game was organized at the Sabancı University Sports Center to emphasize the importance of physical activity. Within the theme of addiction, an informative presentation was delivered on drug use, its causes, and its consequences. The presentation addressed in detail the main factors that trigger substance use, such as peer pressure, stress, and lack of awareness. In addition, the negative effects of drug use on individuals' physical and mental health, as well as the problems it causes at the societal level, were thoroughly discussed. Information was also shared about current issues related to animal rights and cases of violence against animals. Afterwards, creative poster activities were carried out to draw attention to animal rights. Students participated in the International Day Fair organized at Sabancı University. The event provided an environment where cultures from different countries around the world came together and were shared.







Extracurricular Activities

Humanity Courses - Team Games Workshop



The Team Games Workshop was organized by Zeynep Bahar and Aslı Acar Geliş on February 6, 2025, for the teaching assistants of the Humanity and Society Courses (SPS 101/102) at Sabancı University. The workshop featured interactive games designed to strengthen teamwork, with a focus on communication, collaboration, and problem-solving skills. Participants had the opportunity to enhance their interaction with one another in a fun and engaging environment.

Talloires Network and Engaged Universities



Sabanci University CIP has become a member of the Talloires Network of Engaged Universities, which strengthens the social engagement of universities for a more just and sustainable world. Talloires Network of Engaged Universities (TNEU) aims to strengthen the role of higher education institutions in serving society and fulfilling their social responsibilities, and encourages cooperation among member universities. This global network, which includes 445 universities from 92 countries, supports social responsibility in higher education and enables the exchange of good practices. The announcement of CIP becoming a member of the Talloires Network of Engaged Universities was also included in the TNEU February newsletter.

SU Gender & CIP Scavenger Hunt



SU Gender & CIP Scavenger Hunt event took place on March 12, 2025 in cooperation with SU Gender and CIP as part of March 8th International Women's Day. At the event themed on dating violence, participants explored the campus to find answers to questions about the definition, types, early signs of dating violence, and healthy and safe relationships. SU Gender, Civic Involvement Projects, Center for Individual and Academic Development (CIAD), Foundations Development Directorate, International Relations Office, Information Center, and the office of Prof. Dr. Zehra Sayers were among the routes where questions were hidden.

MEF Schools Ulus Campus CIP Training



CIP Trainings were held at MEF High School Ulus Campus on March 10th, 12th, and 19th, 2025. During the training, 9th-grade students of MEF High School Ulus Campus and 6 volunteer teachers participated in training sessions and interactive activities on topics such as the functioning of CIP, volunteerism, leadership, teamwork, and communication skills. The trainings were led by Zeynep Bahar, Neşe Aktuğ Okumuş, and Aslı Acar Geliş from the CIP Office, along with CIP supervisors Eylül Yaltır, Mercan Saygı, and Zeynep Kılınçer.

Addiction Education



Pinar Türker from Sabanci University Center for Individual and Academic Development (CIAD) conducted a comprehensive training on addiction for the supervisors of the CIP on March 12, 2025. The training covered the basic criteria of addiction, different types of addiction, its causes, risk factors, and its negative effects in detail. Additionally, common misconceptions about addiction were shared with the supervisors. Following the training, Aslı Acar Geliş from the CIP Office demonstrated interactive methods for applying the topic of addiction.

Sustainability in Agriculture: Global Challenges and Local Solutions



The first event of WWF & CIP Community took place on March 13, 2025 at Sabancı University campus. At the event, Prof. Dr. Zafer Yenal, a faculty member of Sabancı University Business School, discussed "Sustainability in Agriculture: Global Challenges and Local Solutions". Two documentaries were screened, focusing on the Tony's Chocolonely brand and the urban agriculture stories of the Mezitli Solinova Women's Producer Cooperative. Following the screenings, sustainability in agriculture in both Turkey and the world was discussed. The main topics of discussion included child labor in agriculture, biodiversity, hunger and malnutrition, the food crisis, alternative food networks, and the environmental and social costs of the Green Revolution.

Extracurricular Activities

Activity with Children with Autism on Campus



On April 16, 2025, we had the pleasure of welcoming children with autism from Yumrukaya Special Education Practice School to Sabancı University campus. Our supervisor and overvisor students played fun games with the children on the upper lawn of the university center. In the second part of the event, Sabancı University staff members organized activities with the children at SU Club.

Sabancı University's CIP Experience Shared at Tufts University



Zeynep Bahar, CIP Manager, participated as a speaker at an event themed around civic engagement held at Tufts University's Tisch College of Civic Life on 24 April 2025. In the session titled Civic Engagement in Action, the CIP model, one of the most important innovations introduced by Sabanci University to higher education in Türkiye and implemented continuously since 1999, was presented to faculty members and students. The session featured examples of how this model fosters active citizenship among young people, how education and social responsibility are combined, and how students' social contributions are made tangible. Sabancı University's approach, which places university social responsibility at its core, is based on a holistic understanding that encompasses not only students but the entire institutional structure. This approach inspires other higher education institutions with the university's contributions to building a more equitable, inclusive, and participatory

University Social Responsibility Network



CIP joined the University Social Responsibility Network (USRN) to strengthen and increase the visibility of its work in the field of social responsibility on an international platform. Established in 2015 and based in Hong Kong, the USRN aims to foster collaboration among universities in the pursuit of a more just, inclusive, and sustainable world through social responsibility initiatives. Bringing together 21 member institutions from around the world, the network encourages the exchange of knowledge, experience, and best practices among universities. The Hong Kong Polytechnic University serves as the Chair of the Executive Committee and hosts the Network Secretariat. Through its USRN membership, CIP aims to expand the impact of its socially responsible initiatives and promote them more broadly within international academic and civil society networks.

International Staff Week - Introduction to CIP




As part of the International Staff Week organized by Sabancı University International Relations Office, Aslı Acar Geliş from the CIP Office presented the CIP model on May 12, 2025. The presentation provided a detailed overview of the structure, implementation processes, and impact of the CIP model, which aims to foster social responsibility among university students. Participants had the opportunity to learn about this unique approach that integrates civic engagement with university education, and to discuss the model's adaptability and implementation in their own institutions.

Inclusive Ideas Workshop



As part of the Disability Awareness Week (May 10 - 16), the Inclusive Ideas Workshop was held on May 14, 2025, through the collaboration of Tuzla Municipality, Tuzla Provincial Directorate of National Education, and Istanbul Okan University. The aim of the workshop was to develop solutionoriented proposals for an inclusive and accessible urban life, raise awareness based on the lived experiences of individuals with disabilities, and transform these proposals into actionable policies for local governments. Throughout the event, participants generated solutions on a wide range of topics - from education to employment, social support systems to urban accessibility. The outcomes of the workshop were compiled into a report to be shared with relevant units of Tuzla Municipality. Selen Avcı from the CIP Office, contributed to the workshop with insights on urban space, accessibility, and digital inclusion.

TOM Experience Was Shared with International TOM Campuses



CIP Overvisor and TOM Fellow Birsen Beril Bildirici shared her TOM experiences at Sabancı University during the Fall 2024 and Spring 2025 semesters with the international community at an online event organized by TOM on May 18, 2025. Throughout the event, she listened to the projects of TOM Fellows from different countries and explored best practices. This event not only provided participants with the opportunity to present their own projects, but also served as an excellent platform to observe how the TOM philosophy is implemented globally and to gain inspiration from projects carried out at various universities.

Extracurricular Activities

Toy Design for Children with Autism



Within the scope of the TOM@University Project, CIP supervisors and overvisors focused on designing a toy that could be used in activities with children with autism. Former CIP supervisor and Psychologist Begüm Kobanbay, who specializes in the field of autism, also contributed to the work as an advisor. The students aimed to design a tool to support children with autism in recognizing and expressing emotions. At the end of the semester, a 3D emotion dice was designed as the final product of these efforts and was produced in three dimensions with the support of CoSpace. The tool produced will be used in activities with children with autism within the Disability Schools Projects carried out as part of the CIP course. This process not only offered a creative design experience focused on social benefit but also contributed to deepening the students' knowledge and awareness of autism.

Companions to Brave Girls




Within the Companions to Brave Girls Project, carried out in collaboration with Aslıhan Dağıstanlı Aysev, the author of the book Companions to Brave Girls, online English lessons are provided by volunteer students from Sabancı University to students living in socio-economically disadvantaged regions. Supervisor Selections



Team leaders conduct the CIP 101 course, referred to as supervisors, who are composed of volunteers. Supervisor selections are held every term.


The supervisor selection process consists of three stages:

- Submission of applications by candidate students.
- Group interviews.
- Individual interviews.

44 students applied to become supervisors, including 30 women and 14 men.

Between May 12–13, 2025, seven group interview sessions were held. Twenty-eight students qualified for individual interviews.

During the one-on-one interviews held on May 15-16, 17 students were selected as supervisors.



The projects carried out within the scope of the CIP 101 course are conducted by CIP supervisors. After leading projects for four semesters, each supervisor takes on the role of an overvisor and continues to work by specializing in their preferred areas within the CIP. Five of our supervisors for the Spring 2024-25 semester are international students.





Trainings for the Team

ALL CIP









The ALL-CIP event of the semester took place on February 9, 2025, at Sabancı University campus with the participation of our supervisors and overvisor students. During the event, CIP Manager Zeynep Bahar shared insights on the core principles of CIP, the roles of supervisors and overvisors, the projects carried out in the Fall 2024 semester, and the upcoming projects and activities for the new term.

As part of the collaboration between Civic Involvement Projects and the Sabancı Foundation's Changemakers Program, Hale Uçuş, founder of the Barrier-Free Mathematics Education Platform and one of the 15th Season Changemakers, was awarded the Sabancı University Special Award by socially conscious Sabancı University students. Hale Uçuş received this meaningful award at the ALL-CIP event and had the opportunity to meet with CIP supervisors and overvisors.

Additionally, students who served as CIP supervisors and overvisors in the Fall 2024 semester were recognized for their contributions. The Most Inspiring Supervisor Award for Fall 2024 was presented to Bensu Ünal, while the Going Above and Beyond Overvisor Award was given to Baran Gül.

The event also featured a practical session called One Semester in One Hour, a simulation designed to provide a fast-paced experience of the CIP process. CIPs Academy







CIPs Academy took place on Saturday, February 15th at Karaköy Minerva Han with the participation of our supervisor and overvisor students. Gökçesu Özgül, Education Coordinator of SU Gender, held a workshop on Dating Violence. During the workshop, the definition of dating violence, forms of dating violence, the concept of consent, personal boundaries, and safe relationships were discussed. The aim was to foster an understanding of gender equality and the creation of safe relationships.

In the second half of the day, Aslı Acar Geliş conducted a workshop on Facilitation in Discussion Weeks. This session aimed to provide the supervisor and overvisor students with practical knowledge and skills on how to lead effective and constructive discussions. The focus was on how to plan discussion processes, maintain balance among participants, and bring together different perspectives in an inclusive way. Additionally, strategies for facilitators were covered, including active listening, managing group dynamics, dealing with challenging situations, and creating a safe environment during discussions.
